What's so hard to understand, 2E0!? So many people could not understand 2E0. Have they never hear one before?! Not complaining, nice rare mult! Due to antenna problems on 40m not too much was worked which meant a lower score (no USA hardly on Saturday night . . . **2E0CVN/p**. Poor conditions below 20m . . . **2E0SJC**. Great contest. Thank you! . . . **4L4WW**. What fun from a real station at CN2R. Everything worked fine this trip. Thanks for all the QSOs . . . **5C5Z**. Unfortunately I had no microphone on Saturday and managed to get on the air only on Sunday afternoon. Tough to get attention when everybody is beaming elsewhere and propagation is not good . . . **5Z4/9A3A**. Highlight was Sunday night 7:00 PM local on 15m when everybody in western EU could hear my barefoot rig without repeats. It was magic. Beam direction: due north over the pole . . . **7J1AQH**. 8J1S is special amateur radio station to commemorate the centenary of the world Scout movement. Good Scouting to you . . . **8J1S**. It was very poor conditions, especially on Saturday. We used a TS870D (100w); 2-element quad on 10, 15, and, 20m; and a multi-dipole on 40, 80, and 160m. However it is great fun when the band is filled with activity. Our QTH was Skinnskatteberg (JO79UT) . . . **8S0C/5**. Limited time operation; limited RF propagation . . . **9A2U**. Enjoying the contest. Thank you . . . **9A5ZP**. Conditions were very bad to NA. We worked few NA's compared to other years . . . **9K2HN**. We got off to a slow start due to a very high SWR on the A4S on 20 and 15m. We tuned up on 10m and the SWR was near perfect . . . **9M6BRC**. Struggling to receive in the Vy bad power line noise . . . **9N7JO**. Band conditions were great . . . **9Y4LDK**. Always fun and got to work John, ON4UN, and I'm reading his book . . . **AA0NK**. First contest from my new home QTH with a 20m dipole. Had lots of fun. Ears are ringing though! . . . **AB2MH**. Weak propagation from here but a great contest. I'm ready for some sunspots! Some new HFers were confused about their segment privileges . . . **AB5XZ**. At W0AIH in Wisconsin, i.e. portable 9 . . . **AC0W**. Great contest as usual. Although conditions were about as bad as they can be I still had some good 15m time. I didn't hear a peep on 10, however. It is the one contest involving DX where an average U.S. ham can run a frequency . . . **AC9S**. After making 700-plus contacts during this contest I figured that I should actually send my log in this time. Started in the High Power category but my Collins 30L-1 developed problems around 2100Z of the 24th, so the rest of the contest was at 100 watts . . . **AD5XD**. Thirty years in a row for CQ WW SSB, ARRL Phone, and now CQ WPX SSB. It's been fun. Used calls of W7FP, AD7J, WA7AR, VP2MBA and one of three in 1980 CQ WW SSB at KH0AC. Thought Sunday much better than Saturday: . . . **AD7J**. First contest. Had a great time. First four I logged rcvd number incorrectly. Oops . . . **AD7LJ**. First WPX contest. Sure was interesting with just dipoles. Looking forward to next year and getting a "beam" . . . **AE1P**. Would have submitted this QRP, but condx. were awful. Would have submitted it low power, but the rigs I used (Swan 270B and Kenwood TS-820) do about 120w out, so high power it is . . . **AF9J**. Had fun. Wish I had more time . . . **AG4YQ**. Snow static made Saturday night very difficult! . . .

AK1W. First WPX in over 15 years. Used a 75m loop skywire 20 feet in trees. Next year it'll be at the top. hope the extra 40 feet up helps. 10m was dead here: 15m not much better . . . **AK9I**. Join contest in car with mobile antenna . . . **BD1DRJ**. My first WPX SOAB TB+wires. See you next year . . . **CE4CT**. Nice contest but poor propagation . . . **CT1DWT**. This is the one of the most popular contests. It's time to join all together with pile-ups . . . **CT1EGW**. Nice to catch new ones, hi! . . . **CT4GO**. Nice contest. Only 100w and vertical . . . **DF1HE**. Some operators were deaf, but some had excellent ears! It's my first time participating in an SSB contest with QRP. Thank you great guys for your patience with my weak signals . . . **DJ0MY**. First time taking part in the CQ WPX contest using 3-element tribander beam; vertical for 40m and 80m dipole; 1kw. Conditions were extremely bad on Saturday. Worked about 30 hours and stopped when I reached 1 million points . . . **DJ0UD**. This year I worked 15m single band. Not a good deal to reach highest scores. I had to fight hard for every QSO. My active time was about 19 hours. Sometimes 30 minutes without any contact. This year I worked assisted with a DX Cluster connection . . . **DJ1AA**. Again with Yaesu FT-817 + antenna tuner Z11 through inductivity to the coaxial cable to Windom antenna FD3, 21m long, 8m high. QRP output <5 watts. SSB QRP with a poor antenna is a hard job but possible . . . **DJ3GE**. Equipment used: IC-7800 and Alpha 87A feeding a 65.5m long dipole bent several times in all three planes. Max height of antenna fed by an open wire parallel conductor line is 11m only. The antenna is matched by the Sams Matchbox of HB9KOF on all bands . . . **DJ3WE**. Sorry, SSB is not my mode and my the rotor of the FB33 beam was not able to turn around . . . **DJ6TK**. Only fun. In 56 QSOs 55 mults on 4 bands in 140 minutes . . . **DK7AN**. It was very hard and steady work over a long time and a great pleasure for me. But the the worst was the bunch of operators working with horrible adjusted amplifiers. One of the Baltic ones polluted ± 10 kHz . . . **DL0AZ**. DL16XXV was difficult for many ops in a WPX contest, hi. OK, it was the first DL16 call. Read XXV like Roman numeral 25. Then the call is self-explanatory – 25 years of local RC L16 . . . **DL16XXV**. The propagation on the higher bands wasn't the best, but it makes a lot of fun . . . **DL1GDS**. Please Mr. Murphy, next time go fishing, dancing, or diving . . . **DL6RBO**. The sleep steals scores from me always. 73 and tnx around the world . . . **DL7VDX**. I used only a wire antenna for all bands. Where is the category for this? Hi . . . **DL8YR**. FT-1000, 80m delta loop, 160m dipole, test of equipment. First QSOs on 1:8 mHz! . . . **DM3BJ**. Just for fun. Condx average . . . **DM4DX**. I am using a very old tranceiver: TS-120S. It only gave me an output of 30 watts. Other bands are no longer functional. The band condition on the first day was so severe that I only contacted six stations, but I enjoyed the contest much . . . **DU1ACV**. Contest to forget. Terrible propagation conditions on Saturday, but even worse on Sunday with zero QSOs marked in the log . . . **EA1FDI**. EA hams have only 60 kHz to play this game on 40. It's really fair play? . . . **EA3ALV**. 200 QSOs with a dipole antenna and 100w . . . **EA3FHP**. Bad conditions on higher bands 10m and 15m, so everybody was calling in a super-crowded 20m band . . . **EA3QP**. Poor propa-

gation . . . **EA5EH**. A nice way to try out my newly installed Optibeam in my downtown apartment. Made a few 40 and 80m QSOs tuning up the beam! Relaxed atmosphere. Didn't worry about the generally poor propagation . . . **EA5ON**. No 10m stations. Few strong on Atlantic islands on 15 . . . **EA5VK**. I spent it very well in this WW WPX. I hope to find you all again in the next contest on CW . . . **EA8MQ**. Fun weekend. Thanks all for your contacts . . . **EC7ANC**. Very fun contest for my the first WPX in single operator single band. Thank you CQ! . . . **EC8ADW**. Very poor condx until Sunday afternoon . . . **EI4CF**. Nice contest but poor conditions . . . **EI7M**. Next contest should be much better with propagation and software. Many thanks everyone for QSOs . . . **EK0B**. Nice contest! . . . **EW2EO**. Nice test! . . . **EW2WW**. I am 11 years old. It is my first contest! . . . **EY8CC**. My first contest on 40m. Much qrm, hi. Good test for me . . . **FM5FJ**. First real participation to the WPX. Poor propagation the second day . . . **FY1FL**. In 5 years' time, when we're all on 10m, this nightmare will be a distant memory . . . **G0MTN**. This was just a casual entry to see if my new wire antenna works. It works fine! JA, ZL, and VR on 40, of all bands here in QRM alley proved it. Good sport. See you all next year . . . **G0RTN**. Limited time but good fun. Propagation not very good. Ten was hopeless for me . . . **G3OXL**. A struggle with QRP. Using SD Logger for the first time. Good fun . . . **G4GSA**. Pity that I had limited time available this year due to other commitments. The poor conditions meant that 20m was very difficult to operate with 100w from the mobile . . . **G4NXG/m**. Activity curtailed due to EMC problem with a neighbour's musical keyboard and UK Microwavers roundtable meeting on the Sunday . . . **G4WGE**. Lot of QRM, but enjoyed contest . . . **G5X**. Shame about 15m and 10m. Lack of W/VE on 40m and 20m! . . . **G6CSY**. Again time available too short! Must also enhance my antenna! . . . **G7RTI**. Second time in contest and more QSOs than 2006 . . . **G8ZRE**. Time was limited this year . . . **G14AAM**. Due to family and other commitments only managed a couple of hours . . . **GM4UYZ**. Rig was Kenwood TS-570. Antenna Mosley TA-33 at 60 feet. Operating time 24 hours . . . **HH4/K4QD**. This is my first contest in SSB with my new callsign (ex-HK3SGP). Bad conditions on 10 and 15 meters

Good conditions except for 10m. Band almost closed for me. 40m band crowded. Good result with only two omnidirectional antennas . . . **IW0HOU**. Many thanks to all! Very great result I think 80m low Rookie. Last year I won the 40m Rookie. Working conditions: IC-7400, inverted-V dipole at 15m, 100w. Wx condx not very good during operations but I'm very happy . . . **IW3SSA**. Tnx for very fun contest. Many new prefixes on air for my score! To next WPX on CW . . . **IZ0EHL**. Really enjoyed taking part and giving out a few points. Have annual leave booked for the full 48 hr period for 2008 CQ WPX! . . . **MM3XXW**. Started as a parttime effort then I got going . . . **MU0FAL**. Power level was 100w for all bands except 80m where 25–50w was used due to antenna issues. Finished contest early due to logging software problem . . . **MW1MDH**. Had a ball. Great contest . . . **N1GLT**. Worked my butt off. Can't wait for next one. Awesome contest! . . . **N2RRA**. Have 20m end fed Zepp. Works fantastic for first use on HF. Tried 40 and got one contact but SWR light came on and stayed on 20m. Passed General on March 5, 2007. Great introduction to HF. Thanks CQ . . . **N2TEV**. Thank you CQ for the great contest suport and great job . . . **N3TXH**. in four years (2003–06 inclusive) I've never claimed less than 1M points in the WPX SSB, and in 2005 it was 1.275M. This year much worse, only about 0.825M. 20m to EU was disastrous Saturday AM (<100 QSOs!) and poor to mediocre saturday PM presumably due to K = 4 to 5 . . . **N3UM**. Many tough contacts! . . . **N3XZ**. Had thunderstorms Friday through Saturday morning then a VE session 40 miles away Saturday morning . . . **N4CYV**. Most of the stations were from North America but overall had a nice time . . . **NP3CW**. So this is the bottom of the cycle. I am not amused. Great to hear many new HF hams in the contest. Having a VK answer my 100w 40m signal and dipole long path in the afternoon was quite a surprise. Happy to be first U.S. station in the contest for many . . . **NV1N**. Poor condx with poor antennas . Fun and was a blast with the crew as usual! . . . **OE9R**. Parttime M2 operation. The station was not occupied full time. Just a little inter-station QRM. Everything worked flawlessly. Nothing broke and WT-networking really made this a lot of fun. Too bad DX conditions into USA were very poor. Only a brief opening . . . **OH6NIO**. A good contest. hope cu agn next year . . . **OK1BLU**. Very bad propagation on Saturday and only 8 Q's on 10m! But only 27 hrs activity brought me better result than in 2006 . . . **OK1KT**. Unfortunately both our 40m Yagis were lying on the ground so single band was the only option. I decided to go 20m and I had fun as always. I also hope my score was not so bad concerning the propagation given this year . . . **OK5R**. Poor condx. Operated only for fun . . . **OL6P**. Condx on 15 and 10 were very bad. 20 and lower was reasonable. But it's always fun to work in this contest . . . **ON5WL**. Great fun. See you next year . . . **OQ7T**. Last-minute trip to P4. It's all about having fun . . . **P40W**. A difficult contest due to low-band noise and power-line noise on 15. Gotta get tougher on 40/80 till sunspots return! . . . **P49Y**. Bad condx for DX. Next time better . . . **PA1W**. May occasionally extend my contest activities to phone as a change from CW only, so decided to "bring" my voice over the ocean for the very first time to gain some experience With my trx parameter settings (Ten-Tec Orion I/II) . . . **PA3ARM**.
